

- This was a war of ideologies highlighted by military campaigns.







 million deaths)




















A Divided Germany

The Borders of The Berlin Wall

The "Iron Curtain"

"A shadow has fallen upon the scenes so lately lighted by the allied victory...From Settin in the Baltic to Trieste in the Adriatic, an iron curtain has descended across the continent"

-Winston Churchill

Stalin called Churchill's words "a call to war"

Policy of Containment

- ©February 1946
- block the Soviets' attempts to spread their influence
- created alliances
- supported weaker countries
- oputting a "lid" on Communism

Resulted in two major U.S. foreign policies...

Truman Doctrine

Truman's promises to support free peoples throughout the world who resist takeover by "outside pressures".



Truman Doctrine

Support:

Congress supports it 1947-1950 over \$400 million in aid to Turkey and Greece.

Opposition:

No aid to dictators (even non-Communists
Spread US too thin
No inter. In other nations

Truman = Troops



Marshall Plan

Secretary of State George Marshall: US provide aid to any country that needed it. "Not against any country or doctrine but against hunger, poverty, desperation, and chaos".



By 1952 nutrition improved, industry grew, and Western Europe was flourishing; Communism lost much appeal

Marshall = Money
